HISTORY

As the daughter of former slaves in South Carolina, Mary McLeod Bethune was a distinguished educator and served as an advisor in the presidential administrations of Coolidge, Hoover, Roosevelt, and Truman. Dr. Bethune recognized the need for organized unity among black women, which would facilitate a forum to address the many challenges confronting the black community and to open the many doors that were closed to blacks. She proposed the establishment of a united organization of black women, which through collective unity could bring the issues to the forefront. Dr. Bethune founded the National Council of Negro Women in New York on December 5, 1935, for which she served as president for 14 years. In addition, Dr. Bethune founded Bethune-Cookman College in 1904 and she was a tireless crusader for civil and human rights.



The Northwest Virginia Section was organized in 1987 by several at-large members. The Northwest Virginia Section has been instrumental in continuing the legacy that Dr. Bethune began more than 69 years ago. Through its numerous activities aimed at empowering women, their respective families and the community, the Northwest Virginia Section maintains a strong and active presence in the counties of Prince William, Fairfax, Loudon, and the cities of Manassas and Manassas Park.

Since becoming a member of the NAACP, Nyemah has learned that receiving the best possible education is key to understanding the issues plaguing the world today. Her own understanding of global issues and the need for educating the masses is why Nyemah is concentrating her efforts to become a teacher. She has maintained the belief that if she can touch her students at a young age and instill the need for higher education within them, their ensuing search for knowledge can be a start to improving our black communities. Her favorite quote by the late Dr. King is "Life's most persistent and urgent question is, "What are you doing for others?"

Nyemah is a member of First New Birth Baptist Church in Manassas, Virginia where she has been a member her entire life. Each summer since her freshman year in high school, she has volunteered to help teach the children's class during Vacation Bible School. She also assisted the Committee Chairs during First New Birth's events by serving dinner and helping with event logistics. Lastly, she is the church's musician where she played the drums every Sunday.

Nyemah believes that children are our hope for change, and that by becoming a teacher she can be instrumental in helping to shape the lives of our future doctors, lawyers, and political leaders one student at a time.
